RE: Bruce Highway Upgrade – Caloundra Road to Sunshine Motorway – Erosion and sediment control

I refer to the inspection of the Caloundra Road to Sunshine Motorway (CR2SM) project completed by officers of the Department of Environment and Science (the department) on 22 May 2019.

Based on observations made during the inspection the department considers that erosion and sediment control (ESC) management of the site continues to be of a high standard, and is representative of best practice. It was evident that, despite ongoing rainfall being received in the weeks prior to the inspection, that erosion and sediment control measures had held up well. The expanded use of high efficiency sediment basins appears to be providing significant benefit to the project and is a commendable initiative. With the commencement of permanent landscaping works it is anticipated that the risk profile of the project will reduce as further final landscaping treatments are applied.
