

The Logan and Gold Coast Faster Rail project will double the number of tracks between Kuraby and Beenleigh and connect growing communities with more frequent and reliable train services.

Overview

November 2023

Beenleigh station is a key transfer location between all-stops and express services on the Beenleigh and Gold Coast train lines. The Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) received community feedback in 2021 that highlighted strong support for integrating the station with the Town Square, nearby shops, local facilities, and essential services to create community focused spaces and precincts.

Based on this feedback and the need for track straightening to improve station accessibility, TMR is proposing to relocate Beenleigh station approximately 650 metres north of its current location to James and Victoria Streets, near the Town Square and Magistrates Court. This is a change from the original proposed location which was 200m south of the existing station.

The new station will feature a range of improvements to help make travel easier for customers and the community, including raised platforms and increased platform coverage, new lifts and pedestrian overpass, a new multi-storey park 'n' ride, a new bus station, a safer, more accessible pedestrian connection to the Town Square, and active transport connections to local facilities and other key destinations in the precinct.

This station upgrade will be designed and constructed in compliance with the *Disability Discrimination Act* (1992) to provide and improve accessibility for all users.










Beenleigh station proposed layout
